

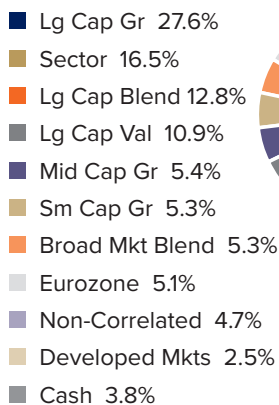

CURRENT PORTFOLIO POSITIONING

The North Square Tactical Growth Fund made no changes to its allocation during the month of March. Market movement and fund flows accounted for the slight changes in the allocation totals since February 29th. The quarter ended with 91.54% of the Fund's assets invested in equities, with international ETFs accounting for 7.64%. Our international ETFs represent the Eurozone and large capitalization global growth stocks. The domestic equity exposure remains diversified with the Fund's

Financials, biotechnology and semiconductors remain our individual sector picks. A municipal bond ETF is our sole fixed income holding at 4.67%. Our cash position is slightly higher than our 2% target at 3.79%. We're watching our holdings closely for weakness and monitoring the ETF universe for what we believe will be appropriate additions to the portfolio.

The Sharpe Ratio was developed by Nobel laureate William F. Sharpe and is used to help investors understand the return of an investment compared to its risk. The ratio is the average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of volatility or total risk.

Correlation is a measure of how investments move in relation to one another. A correlation of 1 means the two asset classes move exactly in line with each other, while a correlation of -1 means they move in the exact opposite direction. A correlation of zero means that the returns are completely uncorrelated, or a "non-correlated" asset.
