INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The investment objective of the North Square Kennedy MicroCap Fund is to provide capital appreciation.

Under normal circumstances, the Fund will invest at least 80% of its net assets (plus any borrowings for investment purposes) in equity securities of micro-capitalization companies. The Fund considers micro-capitalization companies to be companies with market capitalizations generally within the ranges of the Russell Microcap® Index at the time of purchase. As of December 31, 2024, the market capitalization range of the Russell Microcap® Index was between \$1.9 million and \$7.3 billion. The Fund's investments in equity securities may include common and preferred stock, convertible securities, securities of real estate investment trusts ("REITs") and shares of investment companies, including exchange-traded funds ("ETFs") designed to track micro-cap indices.

The Fund's regulatory benchmark is the Russell 3000® TR Index, which measures the performance of the 3,000 largest U.S. companies based on total market capitalization, which represents approximately 98% of the investable U.S. equities. The Russell Microcap® Index measures the performance of the microcap segment of the U.S. equity universe. Microcap stocks make up less than 2% of the U.S. equity market (by market cap, as of the most recent reconstitution) and consist of the smallest 1,000 securities in the small-cap Russell 2000® Index, plus the next 1,000 smallest eligible securities by market cap. One cannot invest directly in an index.

Forecasted Price-to-earnings (P/E) ratio: The forecasted or forward price-to-earnings ratio divides the current share price of a company by the estimated future ("forward") earnings per share (EPS) of that company. The price-to-book ratio is calculated by dividing the current closing price of the stock by the latest quarter's book value per share. The price-to-sales ratio is a valuation ratio that compares a company's stock price to its revenues. The long-term debt to total capitalization ratio is a ratio showing the financial leverage of a firm, calculated by dividing long-term debt by the amount of capital available. The weighted average market capitalization is a stock market index constructed on the market capitalization of individual stocks. The weighted median market capitalization is the midpoint of weighted market capitalization (market price multiplied by the number of shares outstanding) of the stocks in a portfolio.
